The following members were present at City Hall: Brandy Amidon, Mayor, Harvey Choplin, Mayor Pro-Tempore, Grant Bumgarner, Shaniece Criss, Kelly Byers, Rick Floyd, Jeff George, Sara Gilstrap and Brantly Vest. Also present were Eric Vinson, City Administrator, Charlene Carter, City Clerk, Patrea St. John, Planning Director, Ben Ford, Police Chief, Phillip Tate, Public Works Director and Greg Robertson, Fire Chief, Mac McMakin, Assistant Fire Chief and City Attorney Mr. Robbie Childs. The media were notified, and members of the public attended through Zoom online.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Amidon called the meeting to order.

Councilmember Bumgarner made a motion to move item 10. Miscellaneous matters to 8. and item 8. Personnel Committee Executive Session to item 10. Councilmember George seconded the motion and carried unanimously.

2. Approval of Non-Committee minutes from May 11, 2020

Councilmember Byers made the motion to approve and Councilmember Criss made the second and carried unanimously.

3. Public Works Committee

Committee members: Kelly Byers, Sara Gilstrap and Jeff George

- a. Chair Byers called the meeting to order by roll call
- b. Councilmember Gilstrap made a motion to approve minutes from Committee meeting held May 11, 2020. The motion was seconded by Councilmember George.
- c. The Committee had reviewed the Public Works Report for May. Councilmember George commented positively about the steps from the trail to the museum. He asked Director Tate about the Safety program mentioned in the report is a tool safety program. Director Tate hopes to work in conjunction with the fire department. Mayor Amidon asked for an update about the graffiti at the old Ingles building and status. Director Tate responded certified mail had been sent regarding the issue to the owner.
- d. Administrator Vinson explained Pinestone Development Road

Construction Agreement as Eastern Drive at former City Hall will be closed. A new access will be added in the rear parking lot, the developer will incur the expenses and timeline will correlate with Phase I of Pinestone Development. Councilmember George made a motion to send agreement to full Council and Councilmember Gilstrap seconded the motion.

e. Administrator Vinson gave an overview of the Greenville County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan as a collaborative effort with Greenville County and all Cities located within. He described numerous meetings and efforts over the prior 24 months to encompass the area and needs of Greenville entirely. Councilmember George made a motion to send to agreement to full Council and Councilmember Gilstrap seconded the motion.

f. Councilmember Gilstrap made a motion to adjourn and Councilmember George seconded the motion.

4. Public Safety Committee

Committee members: Rick Floyd, Harvey Choplin, Brantly Vest and Kelly Byers

a. Chair Floyd called the meeting to order by roll call.

b. Councilmember Choplin made a motion to approve minutes from Committee meeting held on May 11, 2020. The motion was seconded by Councilmember George and carried unanimously.

c. The Committee reviewed the Public Safety Reports for May. Chair Floyd asked for an update if employees were healthy and safe. Chief Robertson and Chief Ford responded they are. Additional discussions included golf cart use and education, inspections for Fire resuming in several weeks, Furman to re-start August 15. The Committee and Council requested public information and education for issues regarding golf carts, biking on the trail and stop signs on the trail. There was a reduction in Building permits for May and Municipal Court has not been rescheduled.

d. Councilmember George made a motion to adjourn and Councilmember Byers seconded the motion.

5. Planning and Development Committee

a. Chair Vest called the meeting to order by roll call.

- b. Councilmember Criss made a motion to approve minutes from Committee meeting held on May 11, 2020. The motion was seconded by Councilmember George and carried unanimously.
- c. The Committee received the Planning report and update for May
- d. Director St. John provided information for a request to rezone property located at 230 Main St. A motion was made by Councilmember Bumgarner with Councilmember Byers second to send to full Council.
- e. Director St. John provided a summary of the City's existing ordinance for food trucks and provided a summary of other municipal governments similarities and differences. She mentioned the recent complaints and inquires by Council members was the reason for the discussion. Chair Vest asked about the food trucks at the Farmers market and what gaps did she see that may be an issue for the City. Councilmember Criss asked what the permit costs are (\$25) and discussed HOA requesting the food trucks. Administrator Vinson commented on the impacts to neighborhoods. Councilmember Bumgarner mentioned some complaints revealed some food trucks were operating without a business license and DHEC permit. Director ST. John focused on some details like a similar neighboring brick and mortar business giving permission for a food truck to set up within specified feet. Chair Vest asked if the City was working with Northcliff? Councilmember Byers discussed parking in residential driveways as opposed to City Streets. She also commented on reviewing possible loopholes. Councilmember Criss asked and stated again this is just for information. Administrator Vinson also stated there is a difference between public and private functions and will be evaluated as such. Mayor Amidon stated we are not discouraging food trucks, but all businesses need to follow the rules.
- f. The Committee had no further business and Councilmember George made a motion to adjourn with a second from Councilmember Criss.

Administrator Vinson read a recent Thank you from Joann Turner for the recent food drive. He also presented the new maps of the Trail and accommodations in Travelers Rest.

Mayor Amidon provided a big Thank you to Beth and Dean for helping on the Census Challenge with the City of Greer.

9. New Business

Councilmember Bumgarner made a motion to resign to Executive Session for the purpose of discussing Contractual and Legal matters related to Solid Waste Provisions. Councilmember Byers seconded the motion. Administrator Vison, PW Director Tate and City Attorney Robbie Childs also attended.

Councilmember Bumgarner made a motion to return from executive session with a second from Councilmember George and carried unanimously.

Mayor Amidon remarked the Executive Session was for information only.

10. Personnel Committee

Councilmember Bumgarner made a motion to resign to executive session with full Council to discuss personnel related matters for the Evaluation of the City Administrator. Councilmember Byers seconded the motion and carried unanimously.

Public Works Summary for May 2020

- **Sanitation:** Still Tracking complaints on ACE. A total of 3 bags of litter were picked up in the month of June with a total of 1 volunteer. The amount of trash to be collected on Main Street is back to normal with the lifting of some of the Covid 19 guidelines. We had 58 calls for brush pick up on June 18th and 25th with about half of this missed on both dates.
- **Road and Bridge:** The wayfinding sign at the intersection of N Main Street and McElhaney Rd has been replaced. We should be able to start making repairs on McElhaney Rd. The bridge on Sullivan Dr is on schedule to be repaired in a few weeks. SCDOT has cleaned the cross-line pipe on Tubbs Mtn Ext. and this has helped tremendously with the flooding in that area. SCDOT trimmed several intersections that had blind spots from over grown trees. Roe Rd. and Roe Center Ct., we trimmed. Lights were placed along Main St on the trees in honor of the graduating seniors at Travelers Rest High School.
- **Animal Control:** 1 complaint was reported with 0 impoundments. Two traps were set for cats.
- **Sewer:** Due to the increased work load with code enforcement we were not able to perform any sewer inspections. 4 sewer evaluation was conducted on lots in the city. An invoice has been processed and sent to the contractor that hit the force main on McElhaney Rd pay for the damages.
- **Building / Grounds Maintenance:** Versco is performing extra cleanings and disinfecting of the facility to keep our customers and employees safe as possible.
- **Miscellaneous Items**
- **Environmental:** We have had an increase in environmental complaints due to growth season with the grass and several other complaints see attached report for a total open and closed cases for the month of June.
- **Trash cans** We are getting a lot of good feedback on the new trash cans and recycle containers that were installed on Main Street We have

applied for a grant to purchase new cans for trash and recycles cans that will placed throughout the park and downtown areas. This grant will also cover some educational material for recycling to help the city better serve the residents.

- **Safety Program:** We are working to keep the city employees safe and healthy.
