July 15, 2021 6:00 P.M.**

The following members were present: Brandy Amidon, Mayor, Harvey Choplin, Mayor Pro Tempore, Grant Bumgarner, Rick Floyd, Jeff George, Kelly Byers, Brantly Vest, Shaniece Criss, and Sara Gilstrap. Also, present were: Eric Vinson, City Administrator, Lori Sondov, City Clerk, Phillip Tate, PW Director, Ben Ford, Police Chief, Mac McMakin, Assistant Fire Chief, Brennan Williams, Planning Director. The media were notified. There were six members of the public who attended.

A. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

1. Mayor Amidon called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m.
2. Council and staff recited the Pledge of Allegiance

B. INVOCATION

1. The invocation was given by Mayor Amidon

At this time, Mayor Amidon made a motion to amend tonight's agenda to include the following item: Consider Ordinance O-19-2021 to rezone a portion of 208 N. Poinsett Highway (Tax Map Number 0497000500300) from S-1, Service District, to R-M, Residential, Multi-family District. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Bumgarner and carried unanimously.

C. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

1. Councilmember Bumgarner made a motion to approve the minutes for the Regular Council Meeting held on June 17, 2021. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Byers and carried unanimously.

At this time, Mayor Amidon introduced Lori Sondov as the new City Clerk and Treasurer for the City of Travelers Rest. Ms. Sondov previously served six years as the Deputy City Clerk for the City of Greenville.

G. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Chair Byers provided the summary for the Public Works committee meeting.

Chair Floyd provided the summary for the Public Safety Committee meeting. Police Chief Ford and Assistant Fire Chief McMakin provided updates to the committee.

Chair Bumgarner provided the summary for the Ways and Means Committee meeting. Chair Bumgarner made a motion to approve the May and June Financial Reports. Administrator Vinson stated the hospitality tax has been a pleasant surprise despite COVID. Chair Bumgarner thanked the City's Department heads and Administrator Vinson for their fiscal responsibility during COVID. The motion to approve the reports was seconded by Councilmember Byers and carried unanimously.

Chair Vest called on Director Williams for the Planning and Development report. Chair Vest stated Director Williams presented the report on the Planning Commission and said the committee heard about a redevelopment at 208 N. Poinsett Highway as well as amending the Planning Commission By-laws.

H. ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS FOR FIRST READING

1. Mayor Amidon made a motion to consider Resolution R-4-21 to authorize Lori Sondov to sign checks, correspondence, and other documents on behalf of the City of Travelers Rest. Councilmember George seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.
2. Councilmember Criss made a motion to consider Resolution R-5-21 to amend the Planning Commission By-laws. Councilmember Choplin seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.
3. Councilmember Vest made a motion to consider Ordinance O-19-21 to rezone a portion of 208 N. Poinsett Highway (Tax Map Number 0497000500300) from S-1, Service District, to R-M, Residential, Multifamily District. Councilmember Bumgarner seconded the motion and discussion was held. Councilmember Choplin stated he did not believe Council had enough time to consider the Ordinance. Councilmember Vest agreed and added if Council approves first reading, it has a month to give the issue thought before the second reading is held. Councilmember Criss asked if the main concern is about the current residents who live in the mobile home park. Mayor Amidon clarified the rezoning is not for property where any mobile homes are currently located. The motion passed 5-4 with Mayor Amidon and Councilmembers Bumgarner, George, Vest, and Gilstrap voting in favor of it and Councilmembers Choplin, Floyd, Byers, and Criss voting against it.

CITY OF TRAVELERS REST)

AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE APPROXIMATELY 2.15 ACRES OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 208 NORTH POINSETT HIGHWAY FROM S-1, SERVICES DISTRICT, TO R-M RESIDENTIAL, MULTI-FAMILY DISTRICT (TAX MAP NUMBER 0497000500300) (TR 21-10)

WHEREAS, Christopher Rizzo (the "Applicant"), on behalf of Emily Mallonee Youngblood Revocable Trust, owner of property consisting of approximately 2.15 acres located at 208 North Poinsett Highway, Tax Map Number 0497000500300 (the "Property"), applied to the Travelers Rest Planning Commission and City Council to rezone the Property from S-1, Services District, to R-M Residential, Multi-Family District; and

WHEREAS, the Travelers Rest Planning Commission, pursuant to public notice, held a public hearing on June 22, 2021, to consider the proposed rezoning, and the Commission recommended approval of the proposed zoning designation of R-M Residential, Multi-Family District; and

WHEREAS, City Council in its own judgement considered the recommendation of the Travelers Rest Planning Commission and finds the S-1, Services District, to R-M Residential, Multi-Family District, classification to be compatible with the City's Master Plan;

THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Travelers Rest hereby ordains:

1. The Property shall be rezoned from S-1, Services District, to R-M Residential, Multi-Family District, and the zoning map shall be so amended. The attached maps, shown

as Exhibit A, prepared by the Planning and Zoning Department, and the survey shown as Exhibit B, submitted by the Applicant, are incorporated by reference for purposes of identifying the location of the property.

2. That this Ordinance shall be effective upon second and final reading.

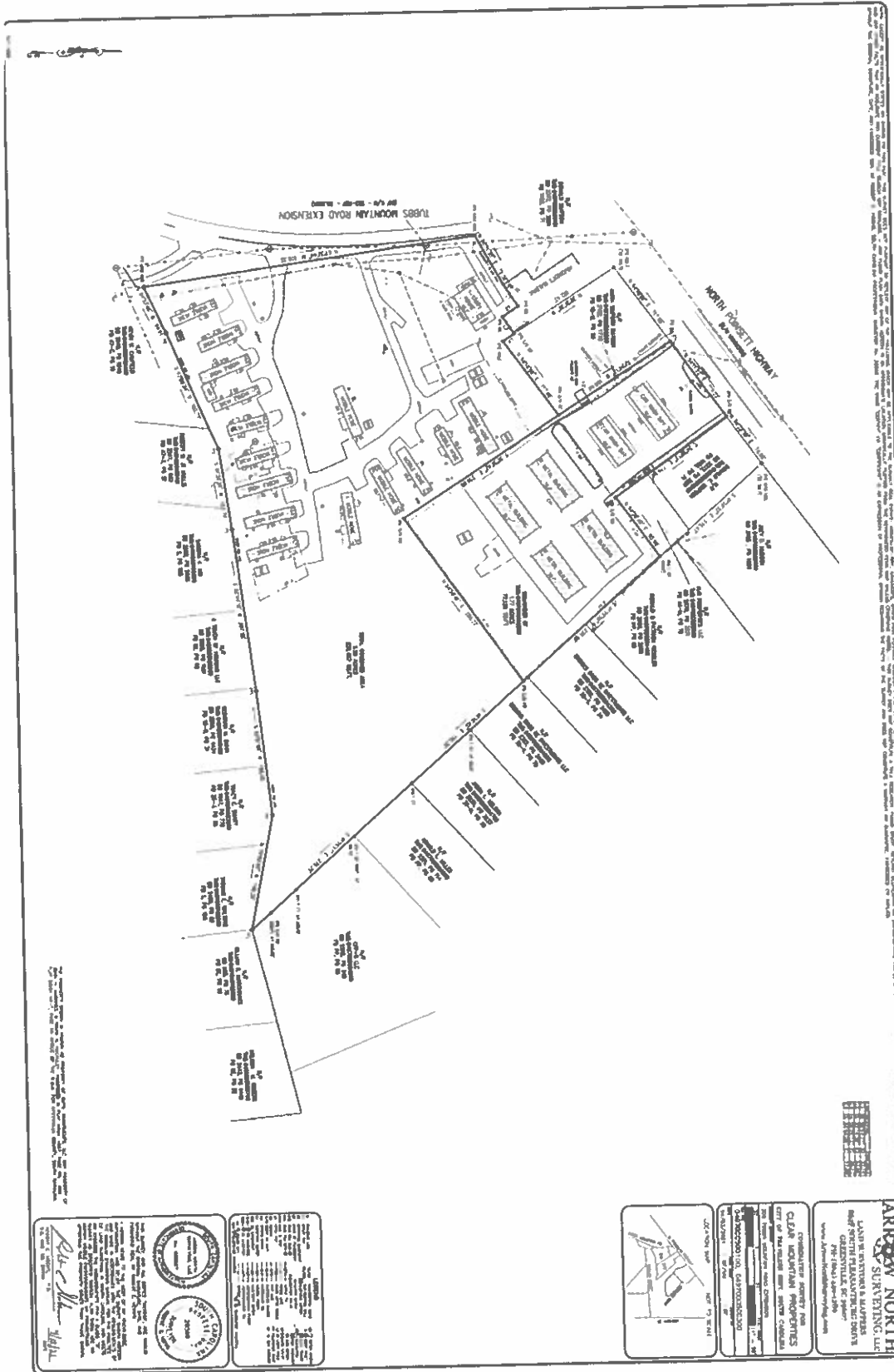

Public Works Summary for July 2021

- **Sanitation:** We are still getting request for recycle carts and Greater Greenville has been delivering these as they come in. Greater Greenville's lead time on roll carts is the end of September. Our recycling program continues to increase, and we expect this to continue as the roll carts are rolled out. We had two complaints the month of July from residential about yard waste not getting picked up. The complaints on the start time have decreased due to greater Greenville changing the collection times.
- **Road and Bridge:** We had a total of 8 complaints from road and bridge. There were two encroachment permits signed for July. Both were for sewer taps on Athens St for two new homes.
- **Sewer:** Two sewer evaluations were conducted on lots in the city. We are looking at conducting more sewer rehab work in the next few months. We are also in the process of applying for a grant to offset some of this cost.
- **Building / Grounds Maintenance:** We are still receiving good feedback on Jan Pro our cleaning service. Public Works staff and Police Department staff has built new office space on the Police Department side to help with staff offices.
- **Miscellaneous Items:** Trail widening project is complete for us and the county. Greenville County Rec. is working now to spread the dirt on the trailside. We are waiting on the county rec to get quotes back planning to apply a seal coat to the section of the trail in front of Loftis Printing to Roe Rd. Greenville County will provide the contractor for this. We were able to install one recycle trash can along the trail near Tree House Café. We also obtained a grant from The Greenville Realtors Association and Duke Energy to help with the construction of Two new dumpster enclosures and other projects on the trail. We will be installing six picnic tables along the trail in a few weeks.
- **SC 811:** The Month of June we had a total 274 locates come through in the month of July. This number will continue to rise due to the building around the city.
